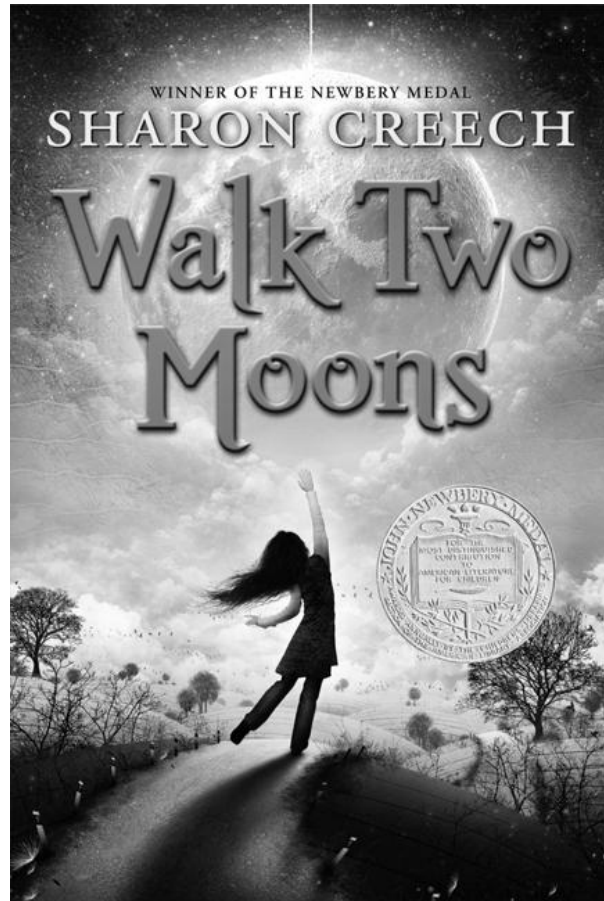

Moccasin – *noun* - a heelless shoe made entirely of soft leather, as deerskin, worn originally by the American Indians.

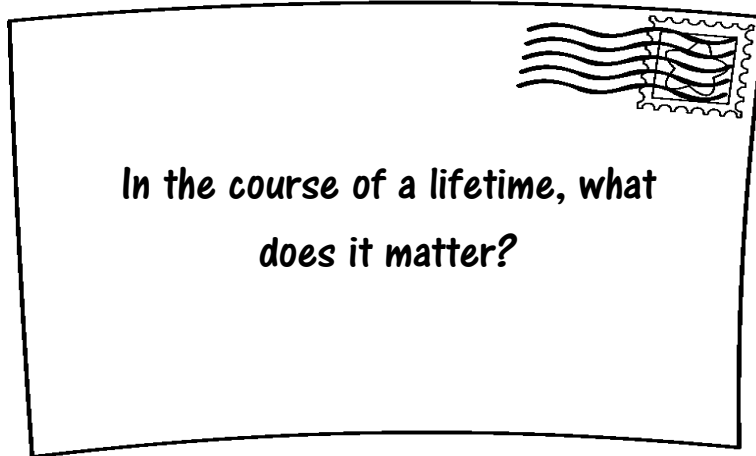
Predict
